Saturday, May 31– June 1, 2014. Starting time each day is 10:00am Registration is open until fifteen minutes before tee time. Entry fee \$25/person, each day. Must be 18+ years of age to participate. The format on Saturday is nine-hole, Mystery Scramble, and Sunday will be a nine-hole Best Shot. In our version of Mystery Scramble individuals choose who they play with, while keeping their own score. The tournament scorekeeper draws random names to place into teams. Established handicaps are used. In our version of Best Ball/Shot/Scramble individuals may choose their own fourperson team, or singles will be placed into a team of four, three or two. Each player tees off on each hole. The best of the tee shots is selected and all players play their second

shots from that spot. The best of the second shots is determined, then all play their third shot from that spot, and so on until the ball is putted out.

Manager's Report

The Memorial Day weekend events were a success, starting with the Petersburg Middle School, then the Wrangell Medical Center Foundation's Brian Gilbert Memorial Golf Tournament, and ending with guests from aboard the Regent Seven Seas Cruise.

With all the fun and excitement, it's easy to forget the safety risks involved in the game, especially with children. The core of the game is a standard of behavior that lends to positive development in children. I encourage all parents and grandparents, aunts and uncles to get involved in the game with the children in your life. Learning proper golf etiquette is perhaps, the most important safety rule of golf. There are several opportunities available for children and families to be briefed on golf standards throughout the summer with instructional clinics and lessons. I am always happy to discuss these opportunities and make arrangements for the youth programs. Safety is important to me, because I know it's important to you, and with safety put first, you'll have more time to spend on the important things-like your golf experience.

Each ticket purchased is always noticed and appreciated.

Grounds crew have been experimenting with pest control throughout the golf course to manage the ravens properly. Grounds crew have observed the birds pecking and digging in areas with saturated moisture, or pooling water under the sod. Muskeg Meadows Superintendent, Wayne Harding's theory is the birds food source (grubs/insect larva) surfaces on the ground with the water accumulation beneath. Rain water accumulation in the ground makes the grass roots easy for the birds to turn over. Ravens can destroy an entire fairway in a matter of minutes when the conditions are right. Fortunately, ravens have not been as interested in their findings as they have been in the past, and have not caused much damage to the fairways. Ottesen's True Value donated ten bags of beneficial nematode granules. Grounds crew have a plan to use the new product in experimental areas, as soon as weather conditions allow.

Its time to begin putting together our 4th of July events downtown. The Wrangell Parks & Recs have given us the use of two large putting ramps, on permanent loan, with the understanding they are considered community property of the City of Wrangell, and may be borrowed by other entities. I would love to hear what kind of competition you would like to see downtown Wrangell on the 4th of July.

I'd like to give a special thank you to Donald Groom and Vincent Balansag for the use of their photography. And thanks to Sylva Ettefaugh with Alaska Vistas for coordinating golf with the Regent cruise ship Seven Seas Navigator. Thanks to Rick Brock and Petersburg Middle School for visiting the golf course for the last day of school, and the Wrangell Medical Center Foundation, Jane Bliss, all the hole sponsors, golfers, and volunteers who made the 7th Annual Brian Gilbert Memorial event possible.
